



The Robert Langer Lab launches new collaboration with Korea University

The Massachusetts Institute of Technology (President: Susan Hockfield), on behalf of the Robert Langer Labs at the David H. Koch Institute for Integrative Cancer Research announced today that they have signed a collaboration agreement with Korea University (President: Ki-Su Lee), on behalf of the Institute for Biomedical Research. The overall purpose of this collaboration is to develop a high impact biomedical research and education program. The initial phase of research will be supported over the first two years. The activities of the collaboration will be overseen by a Scientific Advisory Board, composed of researchers from MIT and Korea University.

MIT and Korea University anticipate that this collaboration will be the first phase of a long term relationship in the area of biomedical engineering, in which the collaboration may evolve to include a broad range of programs for

visiting scholars, student exchange, visiting lectures, sponsored seminars, and expanded co-research initiatives". Collaboration activities will be assisted by Organizational Advisory Board composed of senior leaders at MIT, Korea University, and Doran Capital & Partners.
